DISCOVER KUMATORI

Kumatori is full of things to see, such as government-designated National Important Cultural Properties, old temples, and the brick community center. The historical Nakake Jutaku and Furuike Shoin are particularly fascinating, as is the Raigoji Temple main hall. The town is set amid lush greenery, and has many places to get back to nature, including Okuyama Ameyama Nature Park, Eiraku Yumenomori Park, and Eiraku Dam.

This historic residence is said to have hosted Emperor Go-Shirakawa (1127–1192) on his pilgrimage to Kumano. The main building, front gate, and Chinese gate (National Important Cultural Properties) are thought to have been built in the early Edo period (1603–1867).

Said to have been built in 1329, it was originally a Tendai Buddhist temple and later taken over by the Shingon sect in 1689. The roof features a distinctive "gyogi" thatch, with the tiles thinned at the edge and built up in a staggered way.

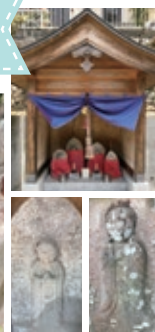

An autumn celebration of thanksgiving for bountiful harvests

Kumatori has a variety of seasonal events, from long-standing traditional ceremonies to sports and everything in between. All are great to watch, so don't forget to see what's on when you're coming our way.



The Kumatori Danjiri Festival is a long-established Shinto ritual to pray for, and give thanks for, a bountiful harvest. The two-day festival's highlights are the "miyairi" procession at Omori Shrine on day one and the elaborate parade of floats from 11 local districts on day two. Many of the floats were made in the 1800s and early 1900s, and all are exquisitely carved.

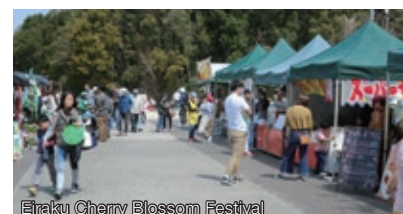

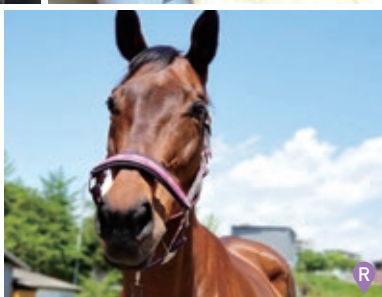

Confectionery

Kumatori is famous for its many must-try confectioners, which are mainstays of where-to-eat websites. The quality is uniformly high and options are endless for visitors with a sweet tooth.

B Strawberry Pancakes

Contracting with farmers in Nagano to supply fresh strawberries in June–December, and Wakayama in January–May, ensures you can enjoy fresh strawberries all year round.



D Scorched Butter Cake

Selected ingredients are kneaded using traditional methods closely-guarded for over 100 years, and are baked until golden. The fluffy, buttery cake is juxtaposed by a crispy fondant coating to create a heavenly experience.
